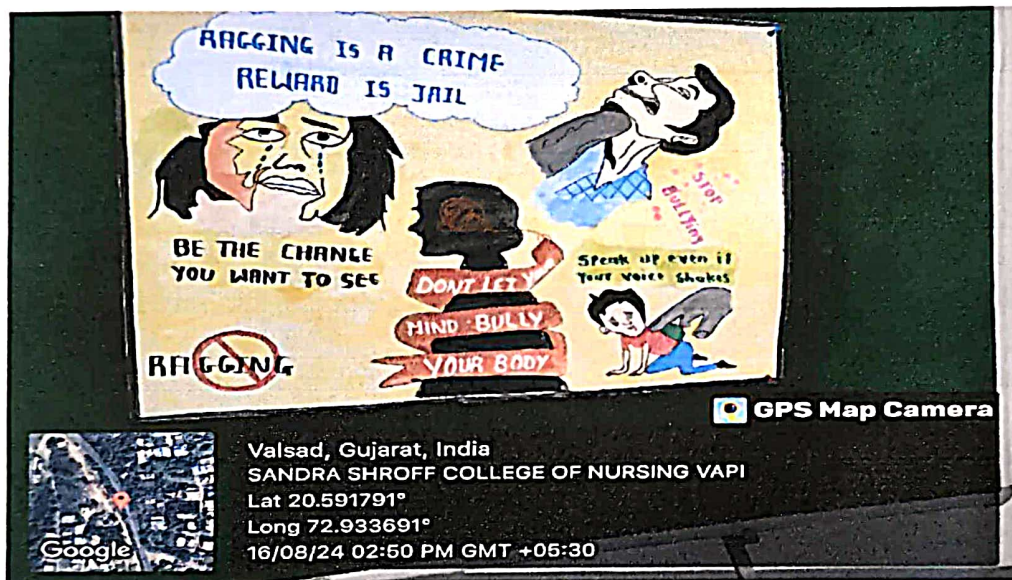

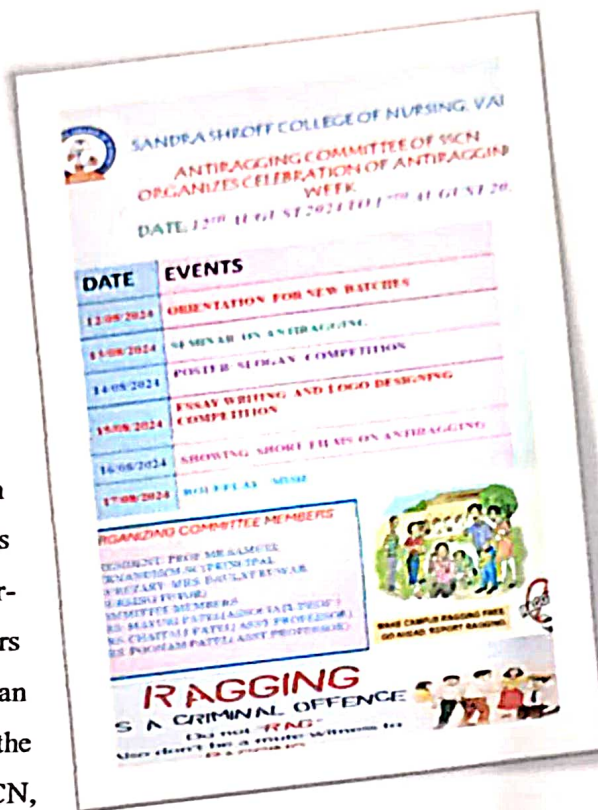
In pursuance of the circular released by the VNSGU 13658/2024 dated Aug 9TH, 2024, Government colleges & Self-Financed Colleges, known for its strict no-tolerance policy against ragging observed the Anti-Ragging Day on August 12, 2024, followed by Anti-Ragging Week from 12th August to 17th August, 2024. This initiative was one of the endeavours to increase awareness against ragging and promote positive interaction amongst the students. Thus, the Campus joining hands with the Union Grants Commission organized a poster-making event wherein students made informative posters based on the Anti-Ragging theme as well as conducted an Anti-Ragging Drive during August 12-17TH, 2024, in the college and hostel Campus premises The Principal SSCN,

Prof. Mr Samuel Fernandis along with Dr. Anita Nawale (Vice Principal), Anti Ragging Committee and its members Mrs. Poonam Patel, and Mrs. Daulat Kuwar scrutinized the posters made by students and encouraged everyone to follow the guidelines of UGC on Anti-Ragging.

Total no of 100 students along with teaching faculties were present during awareness speech and from all batches 25 students took part for poster making awareness campaign.

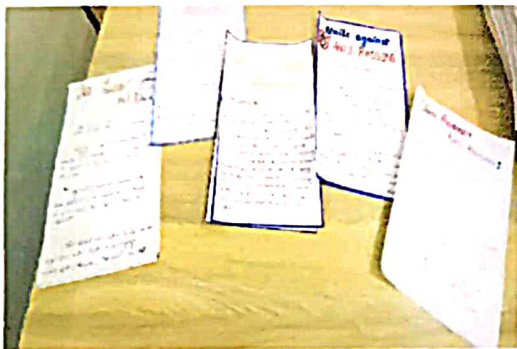
Orientation Session:

Dr. Anita Nawale, Vice-Principle of S.S.C.N, conducted an orientation session for new batches. She stated that Ragging is a form of bullying that can take many forms - from verbal abuse to physical violence. It can have serious consequences for the victim, including depression, anxiety, and even suicide. It can also have a negative impact on the entire institution, creating an atmosphere of fear and mistrust. Students can play an active role in creating awareness about the negative impact of ragging and encouraging their peers to report any incidents of ragging to the authorities. They can also participate in activities conducted during anti-ragging week such as running anti-ragging orientation programs, holding contests like slogans, essay writing, antiragging posters, creating an anti-ragging emblem, and many more. By doing so, they can help



create a safe and welcoming environment for everyone especially new students. The session likely covered guidelines, rules, and awareness related to anti-ragging measures.
