- 9. Encourage children education: specially girl child
- 10. Cleaning campaign within the village area for encouragement of safe and healthy surrounding environment.

Students as well as health workers informed regarding importance of vaccines for each and every child. In the month of December students for almost 8000 children immunization survey.

Children's immunity is fragile. Immunization prevents severe illness, and safeguard from the vaccine-preventable diseases. Some of the vaccine-preventable diseases include

Hepatitis B, paralysis of limbs, amputation of legs or arms, brain damage, hearing loss, brain malfunction that when left untreated causes death.

#### **Importance of Immunization:**

- Immunizations can save your child's life.
- Vaccination is very safe and effective.
- Immunization protects future generations
- Vaccines protect your child against serious illnesses like Polio can cause paralysis
- Measles can cause brain swelling and blindness; and
- Tetanus can cause painful muscle contractions and difficulty eating and breathing, especially in newborns.
- Vaccinating during pregnancy also helps protect a mother from getting a serious disease and then giving it to her newborn.
